

LAKE SWEEP COORDINATORS

INTRODUCTION:

There are two Lake Keowee lake sweeps per year under the auspices of FOLKS. These normally occur in April and September/October. We are assigned 12 Sections at the north end of the lake on the west side of Keowee Key. The Anglers Club point of contact is Ed Stevens (944-2977), who is the FOLKS Fleet Captain.

DUTIES:

The following summarizes the duties for conducting the lake sweep:

- Ed Stevens will notify the Anglers Club Coordinators of the dates for the lake sweep.
- The Coordinators will arrange for pick up of material from Ed and discuss any new requirements along with confirming where the drop-off points for trash and reports will be.
- The coordinators will assemble the required materials into a plastic bag for each assigned lake Section. Normally the bag will contain an overall map, an enlarged map of the assigned Section, instructions for the sweep, report forms, location of trash drop off points, heavy duty trash bags and brightly colored tags for identifying very large items that will be picked up by Duke Energy at a later date. FOLKS bright orange vests will also be given those individuals that don't already have them. Each bag will be labeled with the Section Number.
- The Coordinators maintain a list of Boat Captains who have participated in previous lake sweep efforts along with names of individuals who have indicated a willingness to step in and help if needed. Using this list the Coordinators will contact each Boat Captain as soon as possible after the initial meeting with Ed Stevens to confirm availability and to arrange for pick up of their package of materials. Paul at the Wine Emporium has in the past allowed us to use his store as a place where Boat Captains can pick-up their materials. Finding replacement Boat Captains is the Coordinators' responsibility.
- After the lake sweep is completed the coordinators will consolidate Boat Captain Reports and provide Ed Stevens with a summary report.
- Coordinators will keep a list of all Lake Sweep participants for acknowledgement at the annual January Anglers Club meeting.
