Summer Night Fishing

The July issue of the FLW magazine had an article by Colin Moore about fishing pro Rex Huff and summer night fishing with spinnerbaits. Here are some of his pointers.

Best Conditions

- Moon phase $-\frac{1}{2}$ moon is best with the 2 best times being when the moon breaks the horizon and when it sets.
- Water temperature, the higher the better

Color Coordinated

Black is always a good nighttime choice. A white spinnerbait with a No. 11 Uncle Josh Pork Frog is Huff's favorite. When the moon is dark he uses a brown one with an orange and white pork frog.

Rig Right

He recommends a 6'6" heavy action rod (assume med./hvy. is OK). Uses fluorocarbon or monofilament line in 17 lb. Test. Opt for strength.

Pay Attention

Keep your rod at the 10 o'clock position when reeling and be sure the spinnerbait is on a tight line. Be prepared to set the hook. Stop and go retrieve may trigger a strike but keep a tight line.

The Right Blades

Huff uses 3/8 to 5/8-ounce spinnerbaits with No. 4, 5 or 6 Colorado blades.

Shallow Humps / Bait

Look for humps that come up to about 10' in the main lake. Regardless of depth use your electronics to find humps with baitfish on them.

Cast beyond a hump and fish down all sides of it. Keep moving the boat to cover the whole hump.

Get The Point

Points are always good to check at night. Look for ones with baitfish on them. Cover the point by casting parallel to it first then perpendicular to it.
